- Feb. 25: The Paleontological Society is delighted to welcome applications for grants to implement projects focused on diversity, equity and inclusion and remove barriers to careers in paleontology. The grant award amount is \$500 -\$1,000 per grant. Successful grant applications will convey a clear and central objective for enhancing DEI in paleontology as a major component in the initiative. - March 2: <u>Outreach and Education Grants</u>: Attention paleo-educator members! The E&O Committee is accepting proposals for grants to support programs and activities involving educational outreach and community engagement.
- April 1: <u>PalSIRP Sepkoski Grants</u>, our expanded small grants program for paleontologists in select countries internationally

Other Opportunities

- Feb. 13: <u>Analytical Paleobiology Summer School</u> will be 18 August – 5 September 2025 in Erlangen, Germany. The 3-week school aims to introduce graduate students to various analytical methods foundational to or at the cutting edge of paleobiological research. Limited travel grants. - Feb. 15: Consider applying for a <u>Libbie H. Hyman</u>
 <u>Memorial Scholarship via SICB's Division of</u>
 <u>Invertebrate Zoology</u>, which provides assistance to students to take courses or to pursue research on invertebrates at a marine, freshwater, or terrestrial field station.
- Feb. 28: Applications are open for <u>Conchologists of America (COA) Academic Grants</u>. Proposals must concern a malacological topic, usually within biology or paleontology, with any molluscan taxon or taxa as the focus (max award is US\$2500).
- March 31: Nominate a colleague for the <u>Raymond C</u>.
 <u>Moore Medal</u> for Excellence in Paleontology, given by the Society for Sedimentary Geology (SEPM)!

How is PS working for you?

- The Paleontological Society Journals are seeking an Editorial Intern for the 2025 summer (period of mid-June through mid-August). They will assist our editorial boards and managing editor with revising author guides, preparing Endnote style tools, helping to optimize author and reviewer experiences on the website, enhancing the journals' social media presence, working on blog posts, writing features in *Priscum*, assisting with Special Issues of the journal, etc. Interns will get an inside look at academic publishing by working closely with the Journal of Paleontology and Paleobiology.
